BATTLE – UNFOLDING
ENGLAND’S STORY

Named after the most famous conflict on English soil, this compact market town grew up alongside the battleground. Its tranquil medieval abbey and the surrounding ancient woodlands are largely unchanged to this day.

Celebratory bonfires and battle re-enactments, a year-round programme of lively events, plus an annual festival of contemporary

arts and music, are all features of its enduring heritage.

Stretching out before the abbey’s crenellated walls and arched entrance, the high street is a bustling mix of independent businesses. Craft shops, gift boutiques, cosy pubs and tea-rooms jostle alongside designers representing the best in British sustainability. Leave from Charing Cross or London Bridge and you’ll be there in no time..

BEXHILL –
RETRO ON SEA

Bexhill is undoubtedly best known for the De La Warr Pavilion, a pioneering centre for the arts and feat of modernist architecture. Their programme of music, theatre, comedy and art is internationally renowned. The 1930s art deco-style building stands prominently on the seafront, above a small colonnade, with sun terraces overlooking the English Channel. Put on your best vintage outfit and conjure up those retro images of halcyon days beside the seaside.

Bexhill was first promoted as a fashionable resort at the turn of the twentieth century, with its extended

promenade offering the perfect location for the first motor car races. It was also one of the first resorts to allow men and women to swim together on the same beach. What scandal! Head to Bexhill Museum to find out more.

Today, the town continues to innovate, sympathetically mixing the old with the new. Shop for pre-loved goodies and the latest vinyl record releases. Enjoy fish and chips on the beach or laid-back fine dining. You won’t find neon attractions here but renovated beach shelters, outdoor summer concerts, day festivals and sunset cinema screenings.

HASTINGS – SALTY SEA DOG

Just a stone's throw — well, a cycle ride — from Bexhill, you'll find Hastings and St Leonards. The latter was first conceived as a luxury destination for the most prominent Victorians and is now a creative hub with a strong spirit of community and a flourishing independent scene. Arriving from St Leonards

Warrior Square train station, you'll find the thriving Kings Road before descending the hill to the seafront, where you'll catch your first glimpse of the RIBA Stirling Award-winning Hastings Pier.

The ruins of Hastings Castle overlook the town from atop the West Hill, while caverns reputedly once bestowed with the cargo of notorious smugglers are hidden

from view. Reach it by riding one of the town's two funicular railways. The other scales the East Hill to reach Hastings Country Park Nature Reserve. Set within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, it covers 600 hectares of gorse-covered heathlands, grassland and ancient gill woodland, with stunning views of the prehistoric coastline. It's one of three Green Flag Award-winning parks in the town, the others being the spectacular Alexandra Park and the Regency-style St Leonards Gardens.

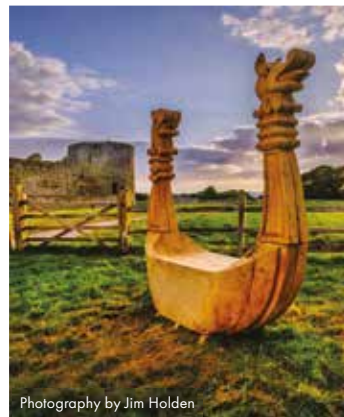
Nestled between the East and West Hills, the Old Town of Hastings is picture perfect. Tudor houses and flower-bedecked cottages are joined by independent shops, pubs and boutique B&Bs. Sit outside on the bustling George Street and watch the world go by. Tour the hard-working fishing quarter with its towering black net huts and fleet of beached boats that make it instantly recognisable. While away the time at the Shipwreck Museum,

Fishermen's Museum, Hastings Aquarium and the purpose-built art gallery, Hastings Contemporary.

Along the seafront, you'll find the usual amusements we all love, and those that have placed Hastings on the international stage. Hastings Adventure Golf hosts the World Crazy Golf Championships each year and Source Park, towards the pier, is the world's largest underground skatepark. A short walk inland, Hastings Museum and Art Gallery inspires with its global collections.

The town is also well known for its eccentric characters and its residents need little excuse for a party. Festivals are hosted throughout the year and include Hastings Fat Tuesday in February, well-revered by music lovers, and the traditional Jack in the Green Festival, where the entire town turns out to release the 'spirit of summer'. Need we say more!

PEVENSEY AND HERSTMONCEUX – CASTLES AND STARS

The bay at Pevensey is where the Norman forces landed, while a mile inland a Roman coastal fort, Pevensey Castle, stands proud. Today the village is an eclectic seaside stronghold, one face hugging the shoreline, the other overlooking a hinterland of levels. This piece of Saxon frontier land has its own original story to tell and a wild side for every season.

Tucked away a few miles inland from Pevensey, further along the 1066 Country Walk, Herstmonceux is a village with many claims to fame – moated castle, former Royal Observatory, science centre and home of the Sussex trug. With its telescope domes, windmill and castle turrets, it sits modestly between Wealden hills and marshland, its eyes on the skies and its feet on the ground.

RYE – STYLISH COBBLED CITADEL

A medieval citadel with an impressive harbour, Rye reveals its history gently. Today its preserved Tudor and Georgian buildings are home to a myriad of art galleries, quirky attractions and cosy pubs, as well as modern boutique hotels and contemporary restaurants, serving the best Sussex has to offer from land and sea.

Walk around the charming-cobbled streets, including the famous Mermaid Street, where each alleyway holds smuggled secrets and timeless tales. The town is known for its antique shops, delicatessens and its traditional Sussex pottery.

Reach to the tip of the estuary and you'll find Rye Harbour Nature Reserve with its new Discovery Centre. Accessible coastal paths follow the shingle shore and encompass the

saltmarsh and wetlands. Home to over 4,000 species of plants and animals, look out from the bird hides to see what you can discover within this mosaic of habitats.

Take in a vineyard tour, savouring the flinty sparkles and fruity aromas of the very land beneath your boots. Enjoy a plate of the plumpest Rye Bay scallops or a dish of salty Romney Marsh lamb. Select the freshest local produce from our farm shops and pick-your-owns. We eat and drink well here. It's our chefs and shopkeepers, our farmers and fishers our winemakers and bakers who make the difference.

Satisfy your curiosity in our museums, reveal stories of travellers, shipwrecks and ancient settlers. Literary legends abound here, think Rudyard Kipling and Henry James. Immerse yourself in modern and contemporary art of international repute. Find your own treasure in the off-beat shops along the winding cobbled streets of Rye, the bustling high street of Battle, the twittens of

Fun-filled family getaway

There's buckets and spades full of fun for all the family in 1066

Country, whether that's building castles in the sands or spotting crabs in the rockpools.

The Observatory Science Centre in Herstmonceux is a fascinating day out, offering hands-on experiments, giant telescopes and an outdoor Discovery Park that will keep your children entertained for hours.

Nearby Knockhatch Adventure Park has a petting zoo, owl sanctuary, go-karts, high ropes, as well as indoor and outdoor playgrounds for your little adventurers big and small. Find play areas hidden in the

woods and make a splash on Bewl Water's giant inflatable obstacle course.

Only the brave dare enter the Smugglers Adventure deep inside the caves of Hastings' West Hill, Speaking of the deep, at the foot of the East Hill Lift is Hastings Aquarium, an underwater world waiting to be explored.

For rainy days, fly high above 1066 Country on the virtual Soar Tour. Clambers Play Centre has a varied play area with ball pools, slides and obstacle courses, both inside and out. For picnics in the sunshine find Alexandra Park in Hastings and Egerton Park in Bexhill.

Reach Bodiam and Northiam on the heritage Kent & East Sussex Railway. You'll find kayaking, rowing, canoeing, stand-up paddleboarding, river cruises and camping. Embark on an adventure quest at Battle Abbey and Battlefield to ignite young imaginations.

For an action-packed day out, visit Drusillas Park – part zoo, part theme park. With a range of animals to see, from sloths to meerkats, spiders to snakes, mazes and rides, you'll need a whole day here.

Play old penny arcade games at the Rye Heritage Centre and watch the latest silver screen smash at the Kino Rye. E-bikes can be hired at Rye Harbour and Camber. Bedgebury National Pinetum & Forest has fantastic cycle paths too, along with 'Go Ape' and play trails. So go on, explore nature and have a wild time.

The 31-mile 1066 Country Walk leads you gently through a landscape that witnessed the Battle of Hastings and whose castles and culture bear testimony to the Norman conquest. Starting at the landing place of William of Normandy near Pevensey Castle, it passes Herstmonceux Castle, the historic 1066 Battle Abbey and Battlefield, medieval Winchelsea and ends in the picturesque citadel of Rye.

The High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty surrounds you, a typical medieval landscape of rolling hills, valleys and vineyards, with cosy pubs and cafés along the way. Ten sculptures on the route are inspired by the Bayeux Tapestry and there are places for you to spend the night and wake fortified for the next few miles!
